Many of you are aware of the announcement made by Joanna Kile at the Gulf Coast Process Technology Alliance meeting on Friday, 1 May. Subsequent emails have been distributed by members of the former CAPT, Inc. and I would like to update the status of the lawsuit filed by College of the Mainland in Galveston County, Texas.

As of this morning, no signed documents have been received by either College of the Mainland or CAPT. At this time we have only unofficial announcements that we trust will be followed by compliance with an actual signed agreement. The court requires the signed document be filed by 15 May 2009.
